About the American with Disabilities Act (ADA)

The ADA is the law that requires the removal of barriers that deny individuals with disabilities equal access to:

- √ **Jobs**
- √ **Public Accommodations**
- √ **Government Services**
- √ **Public Transportation**
- √ **Commercial Facilities**
- √ **Telecommunications**

Title II of the ADA

Title II of the ADA applies to the operations of State and local governments.

A person with a disability is an individual who:

- Has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities.
- Has a record of such an impairment, or
- Is regarded as having an impairment.

Major life activities include:

- Walking, hearing, seeing, speaking, breathing, working, learning, caring for oneself, and performing manual tasks.
