

## Chief Justice Robinson Appoints Judges Bozzuto and Ficeto to New Roles

*December 19, 2022*



Chief Justice Richard A. Robinson announced that the Honorable Elizabeth A. Bozzuto will succeed the Honorable Patrick L. Carroll III as Chief Court Administrator on January 1, 2023. Judge Anna M. Ficeto will succeed Judge Bozzuto as the Deputy Chief Court Administrator.

This is the first time in the history of the Connecticut Judicial Branch that two women will be leading the Branch in the roles of Chief Court Administrator and Deputy Chief Court Administrator at the same time.

“I can think of no other person better prepared and capable to assume the important role of Chief Court Administrator,” Chief Justice Robinson said. “With every position Judge Bozzuto has held in the last 23 years, from trial court judge to Presiding Judge, to Chief Administrative Judge and Deputy Chief Court Administrator, she has brought an unmatched determination to fulfill the core mission of the Judicial Branch. She is forward thinking, intelligent, hardworking and compassionate. I have complete confidence that with her experience, unique skillset, and commitment to excellence she will serve the Judicial Branch and the State of Connecticut well in her new position as the Chief Court Administrator.”

A Superior Court Judge since 2000, Judge Bozzuto thanked the Chief Justice for the honor to serve the residents of the State of Connecticut as Chief Court Administrator. “I am humbled and honored to assume this important role. I thank the Chief Justice for the confidence he has in me to support him in his pursuit of excellence in his leadership of the Judicial Branch. I am grateful we have such talented judges and staff to assist with our daily mission to serve the interest of justice by resolving matters brought before it in a fair, timely, efficient, and open manner,” Judge Bozzuto said.

Chief Justice Robinson also expressed an appreciation for Judge Ficeto accepting the position of Deputy Chief Court Administrator.

“Anna Ficeto has what it takes to help lead the Judicial Branch,” Chief Justice Robinson said. “She is highly intelligent and has a breadth of experience in family matters, and also has been assigned to the criminal division. She brings this experience as well as wonderful common sense to her new position.”

Judge Ficeto has been a Superior Court Judge since 2012.

“I am grateful for the confidence that Chief Justice Robinson and Judge Bozzuto have shown in me, and I look forward to being part of the leadership team at the Judicial Branch. I am excited to work with such a talented group of individuals,” Judge Ficeto said.
