Also participating were Professor Julia Simon-Kerr of the University of Connecticut Law School and academic advisor to the Committee, Attorney Eric Levine, Reporter of Judicial Decisions, Attorney Jillian Greenbacker, Counsel, Judicial Legal Services, and Attorney Lori Petruzzelli, Counsel to the Code of Evidence Oversight Committee of the Supreme Court.

Justice Steven D. Ecker, Judge Barbara B. Jongbloed, Judge Kimberley P. Massicotte, and Judge Lisa K. Morgan, as well as Attorney John R. Gulash, were not in attendance at this meeting.

1. The Honorable Raheem L. Mullins called the meeting to order at 2:08 p.m.
2. Justice Mullins made opening remarks, acknowledging Attorney Joseph Bruckmann for his service to the Committee. Since the last meeting of the Committee, Attorney Bruckmann retired from state service as Chief Public Defender, Judicial District of Fairfield. Justice Mullins also welcomed new members, Attorney Jennifer L. Bourn, Office of the Chief Public Defender, and Attorney Darren Cunningham, Office of the Attorney General.
3. The Committee unanimously approved the minutes of the meeting held on July

21, 2021.

4. The Committee considered a proposal to amend Conn. Code Evid. § 7-3, consistent with the Connecticut Supreme Court's opinion in *State v. Gore*, 342 Conn. 129, 269 A.3d 1 (2022). After discussion, the matter was tabled until the next meeting to allow Judge Prescott and Attorney Steigelfest the opportunity to make revisions recommended by the Committee.

5. Thereafter, Attorney Eric Levine, Reporter of Judicial Decisions, updated the Committee on the status of publication of the 2023 revision of the Code.

6. Subsequently, the Committee acknowledged Professor Julia Simon-Kerr for being named Evangeline Starr Professor of Law at the University of Connecticut School of Law.

7. The meeting was adjourned at 2:58 p.m.
