1. The Honorable Raheem L. Mullins called the meeting to order at 2:02 p.m.
2. The Committee approved the minutes of the meeting held on March 1, 2023. Justice Ecker and Judge Morgan abstained from voting.
3. The Committee considered a revised proposal to amend Conn. Code Evid. § 7-3, consistent with the Connecticut Supreme Court's opinion in *State v. Gore*, 342 Conn. 129, 269 A.3d 1 (2022). Attorney Levine suggested certain technical changes. Thereafter, the Committee made additional edits to the commentary to Section 7-3 (a).
4. After discussion, the Committee voted unanimously to submit Section 7-3, as amended, (in the form attached hereto as Appendix A) to the Supreme Court for

consideration.

5. The meeting was adjourned at 2:25 p.m.
