Also participating were Professor Julia Simon-Kerr of the University of Connecticut Law School and academic advisor to the Committee, Attorney Eric Levine, Reporter of Judicial Decisions, and Attorney Lori Petruzzelli, Counsel to the Code of Evidence Oversight Committee of the Supreme Court.

Judges Kimberley P. Massicotte, Lisa K. Morgan and Michael R. Sheldon, as well as Attorney John R. Gulash, were not in attendance at this meeting.

1. The Honorable Raheem L. Mullins called the meeting to order at 2:03 p.m.
2. The Committee unanimously approved the minutes of the meeting held on January 20, 2021.
3. Justice Mullins made opening remarks, acknowledging the efforts of the working group, which studied General Statutes § 52-180c. Thereafter, he invited comments by Judge Goodrow, a member of the working group, regarding proposals to amend Section 4-11 and adopt a new Section 4-12. Judge Goodrow discussed the revisions to the title of Section 4-11 and received comments from the Committee. Subsequently, the proposed title was further amended. Judge Goodrow also discussed the background of drafting a new proposed Section 4-12.
4. After discussion, the Committee voted unanimously to submit Section 4-11, as

amended, (in the form attached hereto as Appendix A) and new Section 4-12 (in the form attached hereto as Appendix B) to the Supreme Court for consideration.

5. Justice Mullins advised the Committee that a package of its recommendations (Sections 1-1, 1-3, 9-3A, 4-11 and 4-12) would be submitted to the Supreme Court for consideration.

6. The meeting was adjourned at 2:26 p.m.
