A serif font is a font that includes small lines or extensions at the end of its longer strokes. They are frequently used in books and magazines as they are easier to read.

There are different subgroups of serif fonts, such as old style, transitional, didone, and slab serif. The rules of Appellate Procedure permit any serif font.
